Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival to Astorga

It's off to Astorga, a small town in north-west Spain at the foot of Montes de León. The people here have lived from trading for many years – the stony fields not allowing any agriculture. Confectionery manufacture also has a long tradition. Chocolate, hojaldres and mantecados, are just some of the many sweets produced here. In terms of sights – visit the cathedrals and the bishop's palace of Antoni Gaudí.

Day 2: Astorga – Molinaseca, approx. 50 km

Your tour today starts with a challenge: cycling to Montes de León and then up to Cruz de Ferro, a small iron cross that marks the highest point of the Camino Francés. In keeping with tradition, pilgrims leave a stone from their home country here. Next, enjoy a long downhill ride to Molinaseca and the lovely views on the way. Even in Roman times, this town was an important throughway.

Day 3: Molinaseca – Las Herrerias, approx. 50 km

Soon after setting off you arrive in Ponferrada whose castle is worth visiting. Very nearby is Las Médulas, a cultural landscape that has been declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Through the wine-growing area of Bierzo you cycle on to O'Cebreiro, where, alongside the oldest pilgrim churches on the Way of Saint James, you will also see replicas of the Pallozas, the elliptical huts of the Celtiberians.

Day 4: Las Herrerias – Sarria, approx. 55 km

An easier cycle today as you descend to the town of Samos where we you find one of the oldest and most beautiful monasteries in Spain, the Benedictine monastery of Samos.

Day 5: Sarria – Palas de Rei, approx. 50 km

Today, a pleasant section awaits you through rural areas and small villages. The route mostly takes you westwards along roads lined with trees. You cross the Rio Miño, on the other side reaching Portomarín. In the 50s, this had to give way to the Belesar reservoir and was moved to a 50-higher location. Your destination, the small town of Palas de Rei is full of the spirit of the pilgrims.

Day 6: Palas de Rei – Rua / O Pedrouzo, approx. 60 km

Todays cycle tour on the Camino de Santiago takes you gently up and down to Melide. In this small town, the Camino Primitivo meets the classic Camino Francés and connects it with the coastal path. The popular Pulpería Ezequiel restaurant, where excellent octopus is served, is famous among pilgrims. The Arzúa-Ulloa cheese, a Galician specialty, is produced around Arzúa. In Rua you will have reached today's destination.

Day 7: O Pedrouzo – Santiago de Compostela, approx. 25 km

The last section is only short, to give you enough time to enjoy the end of the Way of Saint James – a UNESCO World Heritage Site. But first you must tackle a rather hilly section. From Monte do Gozo, you can set your sights on the majestic cathedral of Santiago e Compostela for the first time.

Day 8: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
