Your tour

In the Dolomites you will encounter crystal-clear lakes in which the impressive rock formations of the surrounding mountains are reflected. You cycle along the route of the former Dolomite railway to Bressanone, Bolzano and Trento. This tour has been specially planned as an e-bike loop, but of course this wonderful trip can also be done by sporty cyclists on a normal bike.

Itinerary

Day 6	Feltre – Pieve di Cadore, approx. 75 km
Day 7	Pieve di Cadore – Niederdorf / Toblach, approx. 65 km
Day 8	Individual departure

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Niederdorf / Toblach

Your e-bike-tour around the Dolomites begins in the middle of the Hochpustertal (the high Puster Valley), at its highest point in Toblach or Niederdorf. The watershed between the Adriatic and the Black Sea is located here. A visit to the Höhlenstein Valley with a view of the majestic Drei Zinnen (Tre Cime di Lavaredo) is recommended. The winter sport town of Toblach also has much to offer, even in Summer.

Day 2: Toblach – Mühlbach, approx. 55 km

On the first stage of the e-bike-tour around the Dolomites, you start on the Pustertal cycle path. You follow the river Rienz, which leads you to Bruneck. Take a short break before you cycle past the impressive ruins of the Mühlbacher Klause into the Eisacktal valley. Once you arrive at your stage destination Mühlbach, you should not miss a stroll through the medieval-looking village.

Day 3: Mühlbach – Bozen, approx. 55 km

Soon you will reach Brixen. During a walk through the narrow arcades, you should look up - numerous oriels adorn the old buildings. The bubbling Eisack leads you out of Brixen. As the valley narrows, the

beauty of the Dolomites reveals itself to you. Through the Bolzano basin you reach Bolzano, the capital of South Tyrol. This is where Italian joie de vivre meets the Tyrolean lifestyle!

Day 4: Bolzano – Trento, approx. 70 km

Today's route along the Adige Cycle Path leads you through extensive vineyards. Cycling through the typical Southern Tyrolean villages of Ora and Egna, you will reach Salurn. This is where the German-speaking region of Tyrol ends. You will then continue on towards Trento where you shouldn't miss the Old Town with its Romanesque Cathedral and the Baroque Neptune Fountain. Stroll along Via Belenzani with its beautiful old buildings.

Day 5: Trient – Feltre, approx. 70 km + trainride or approx. 95 km

Through Valsugani valley, which is completely surrounded by the Dolomites, you cycle past the glittering Caldonazzo lake, which is perfect if you feel like a break. The first section to Caldonazzo is very steep and can be shortened by train (not included – Depending on where you stay overnight on day 4, you can shorten the route by train on day 4 or 5.). Continuing through this wonderful valley you soon

arrive at the former Via Claudia Augusta, once an important Roman road from the Adriatic to Augsburg. In Feltre, enjoy more wonderful views of the Dolomites!

Day 6: Feltre – Pieve di Cadore, approx. 75 km

On today's section you cycle through gentle green avenues to Belluno. The capital of the province of Veneto looks back on over 2000 years of history. Discover the numerous beautiful sights this town has to offer. In the north, the striking Dolomite peaks welcome you back – which accompanied you on the first section. You follow the cycle path north and after about 20 km arrive in Longarone. This small town has a sad history. After a landslide in 1963 into a higher-lying reservoir, a flood wave developed which destroyed the town almost entirely except for a church tower. The newly established cycle path takes you on to Pieve di Cadore.

Day 7: Pieve di Cadore – Niederdorf / Toblach, approx. 65 km

Your first break can be taken in Cortina d'Ampezzo, the famous winter sports grounds and Olympic village from 1956. This small town is surrounded by some of the most beautiful Dolomite peaks. Enjoy the panorama. On the tracks of the old Dolomite railway, you cross the border to South Tyrol. The striking tops of the Three Peaks can be seen from afar.

Day 8: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
