

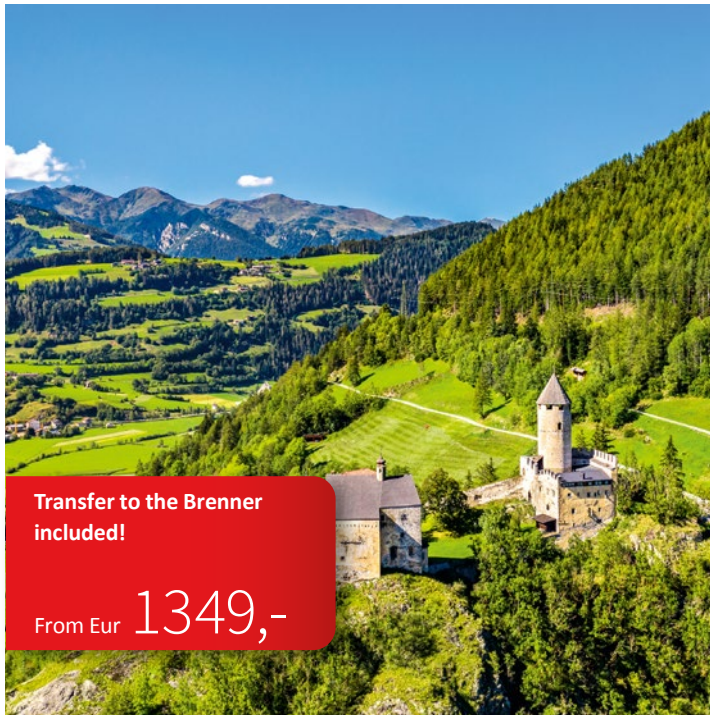
Eisack and Adige: From Innsbruck to Venice

Your tour

Along old trade routes and disused railway lines you cycle from the capital of Tyrol to the lagoon city. You start your bike tour in a relaxed way: With a transfer to the Brenner Pass. Afterwards, you cycle leisurely through South Tyrol, where the very own culture and tradition can be felt everywhere. From the festival city of Verona, you leave the impressive mountain panoramas behind you and cycle past sun-drenched vineyards and thermal springs to Venice.

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Innsbruck

Pfiat di in Austria! Grab your bike and explore Innsbruck, famous for the Golden Roof. Located near the Inn River, bike through Innsbrucks Old Town, which is characterized by town houses and densely built narrow streets. Stroll through Innsbrucks Hofgarten, a listed park on the edge of the old town.

Day 2: Innsbruck – Brixen, approx. 50 km + transfer

By minibus or train you will go from Innsbruck to the Brenner Pass today. From the small community of Brenner, you will be cycling in Italy. Your journey on the Eisacktal Cycle Path to Venice is about to begin! Following the course of the Eisacktal Cycle Path, you will cycle through the Fugger town of Sterzing, past the Franzenfeste and the quietly situated Vahrner See. Arriving in the bishops town of Bressanone, you are now in the middle of the Valle Isarco. Surrounded by orchards and

vineyards, a short walk through the historic alleys, to the cathedral and the Hofburg castle is worthwhile. A cable car ride to the Plose, one of Bressanones local mountains, rewards you with the beautiful view over the valley and the Dolomite peaks.

Day 3: Brixen – Bozen, approx. 40 km

Today you will cycle through vineyards along the Eisack to Klausen. Here it is not a mighty castle which rises above the countryside, but a Benedictine monastery which is still inhabited today. There is enough time to explore the state capital Bozen. Do what ever you fancy, whether it is relaxing on the Walther Square, or taking a look at the famous Ötzi Mummy at the archaeological museum.

Day 4: Bolzano – Trento, approx. 70 km

Today's route along the Adige Cycle Path leads you through extensive vineyards. Cycling through the typical Southern Tyrolean villages of Ora and Egna, you will reach Salurn. This is where the German-speaking region of Tyrol ends. You will then continue on towards Trento where you shouldn't miss the Old Town with its Romanesque Cathedral and the Baroque Neptune Fountain. Stroll along Via Belenzani with its beautiful old buildings.

Day 5: Trient – Ala / Rivalta, approx. 45 / 60 km

Today you cycle along the Adige River through Rovereto, among other places. The old town, overlooked by a castle, with its small streets and Venetian-style buildings, is ideal for a breather. The picturesque Ala, the city of velvet, also has an interesting old town where Napoleon and Mozart once lived. The route continues along the Adige river to Rivalta.

Day 6: Ala – Verona, approx. 65 / 50 km

Today Verona is on your program! Stroll leisurely through the Piazza della Bra to the almost 2000-year-old Roman amphitheater. Where once gladiators fought, today opera performances and concerts take place. Very impressive! A walk across the Ponte Pietra and a visit to the Casa di Giulietta, the house from Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet, are a must, as is the climb up the hill of San Pietro, which offers you a beautiful view over the Adige River and Verona.

Day 7: Verona – Vicenza, approx. 70 km

Today's route starts off quite flat before reaching the Berici Hills. If today's route is too long you also have the option of taking the train in San Bonifacio. The Old Town of Vicenza is characterised by impressive buildings by the famous architect Andrea Palladio from the 16th century. The Teatro Olimpico, the first post-antique free-standing theatre building in Europe is also one of his works.

Day 8: Vicenza – Abano Terme, approx. 35 km

Cycling along streets lined with villas, you will leave Vicenza and arrive in one of the most famous bathing spa towns in Italy. Treat yourself and use the time for a long visit to the thermal baths or visit Padua, one of the oldest cities in Italy (which can be easily reached by bus). Here you should visit the famous Basilica of St. Anthony.

Day 9: Abano Terme – Venice-Mestre / Marghera, approx. 50 km

With the light breeze, which is common in this area, at your back you will cycle towards the sea. Your destination for the day is the mainland near Venice. From here there are excellent connections to the lagoon city, which has been on the UNESCO world heritage list since 1987. Explore the imposing St. Mark's Cathedral and visit the Gothic Doge's Palace. A trip with a gondola is a very special way to explore the city.

Day 10: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
