Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Prague

Welcome to your bike tour from Prague! An early arrival in the Golden City is recommended, so you can also enjoy one of the most beautiful cities in Europe to the fullest. Stroll past the Astronomical Clock, across Charles Bridge to Prague Castle! From here you have a breathtaking view of the city. In the evening, try the famous Czech beer in one of the many small pubs.

Day 2: Prague – Nymburk, approx. 65 km

Prague's city planners certainly had foresight - part of our cycle route runs directly over the underground tunnel! From Prague, we cycle north-east towards the fertile Polabí region, stopping along the way in the historic centre of Čelákovice and then in Přerov nad Labem, home to the oldest village culture museum in Europe. On a hot day, you can take the opportunity to swim in a local lake before we arrive in the old royal town of Nymburk with its ancient walls bordering the Elbe. Here we must try the local Postřižiny beer to commemorate the Czech writer Bohumil Hrabal, who grew up in the local brewery!

Day 3: Nymburk – Kutná Hora, approx. 40 km

On a pleasant and easy cycle path, we cycle along the river to the spa town of Poděbrady and on to the royal town of Kolín with its ornate Renaissance synagogue. From Kolín, we leave the Elbe and cycle to one of the UNESCO sites on our to-do list - the old silver mining capital of Kutná Hora. During the Middle Ages, it was one of the most important towns in Europe and was extremely rich thanks to its mines, its coinage and its location on trade routes. Thanks to all this, we can relax in the cosy old town, which consists of fascinating medieval and Baroque buildings. The whole thing is crowned by the impressive Church of St Barbara - a true jewel of Gothic architecture!

Day 4: Kutná Hora – Pardubice, approx. 55 km

Before leaving Kutná Hora, we visit an extraordinary place - the Sedlec Ossuary, whose decoration was created from the bones of more than 30,000 people, making it a curious and macabre exhibition. Just before we return to the Elbe, we can visit the beautiful classicist-style Kačina Castle. Back on the river, we cycle to the Kladruby National Stud Farm, which has produced exceptional horses for the Habsburgs since the 16th century. In the afternoon, we cycle along Lake Buňkov and take a break to relax on the beach or even go for a swim. Today's last stop is the medieval town of Pardubice. A charming, quiet old town with a beautiful castle and old alleyways, but also home to the SEMTEX plastic explosive. For those in search of something sweet - you've found it! -Pardubice is the Czech capital of traditional gingerbread.

Day 5: Pardubice – Litomyšl, approx. 60 km

Leaving the Elbe, we come across the first gentle hills and the mighty Kunětická Hora Castle. A short diversions and a climb up the majestic hill are definitely worth a try! After a break, we reach the Loučná River and follow it to the village of Vraclav and its monument to the Vršovec noble family. Next stop is the town of Vysoké Mýto: today it is a centre of bus construction, whose much longer history is shown by a beautiful town square and beautifully preserved town gates. Today's accommodation is in the UNESCO-protected town of Litomyšl, which is home to a fantastic Renaissance chateau with breathtaking gardens. Litomyšl is also the birthplace of the famous composer Bedřich Smetana, who is celebrated every year with a classical music festival - a highlight of the Czech cultural calendar.

Day 6: Litomyšl – Moravská Třebová, approx. 45 km

On this day, we say goodbye to Bohemia and cross the historic border to Moravia as we travel the gap between the Bohemian-Moravian Mountain Railway in the south and the Eagle Mountains in the north. We can admire the Renaissance town of Svitavy with its beautiful square and explore the history of its most famous inhabitant, Oskar Schindler, who was not favoured by the locals. From here we have to climb over the Hřebeč Mountains, but our route soon leads slightly downhill to our accommodation in the town of Moravská Třebová. This small town is home to a fantastic Renaissance chateau, one of the best examples of its kind in Moravia.

Day 7: Moravská Třebová – Olomouc, approx. 70 km

Our day starts nice and easy along the river Třebůvka, still along the old border between Bohemia and Moravia, there is a high density of castle ruins, which today are mostly just a few stones. But as we leave the river, we come across the largest of today's castles - Bouzouv, one of the most romantic places in the Czech Republic. Shortly after, we leave the highlands and descend to the Morava River, which will more or less guide us through the rest of the day. If you are interested in reaching our accommodation in the UNESCO town of Oloumoc faster, you are welcome to take the train. Otherwise, enjoy the cycle route along the meandering river. Olomouc, the ancient capital of the Moravian Empire, rewards its visitors with fascinating sculptures, dramatic churches and an astronomical clock from the communist era.

Day 8: Olomouc – Hranice / Teplice nad Bečvou, approx. 60 km

Today we follow the river Bystřice. First we reach the Tršice region with its beautiful view of the Holy Mountain. Once in Přerov, we reach the Bečva River and follow the beautiful cycle path upstream. In Lipník, we can admire the town centre with its castle and extraordinary gardens or take a detour up the hill to the mighty Helfštýn Castle. Further upstream we reach the town of Hranice with its Renaissance square. On the other bank of the Bečva, we can relax in the local spa town of Teplice nad Bečvou.

Day 9: Hranice – Štramberk, approx. 40 km

This day is one of the most challenging, but also one of the most interesting of our entire tour. The closer we get to the Czech-Polish-Slovak border, the more castles, castle ruins and historic towns we come across. In the morning, we follow the Bečva River for a few more kilometres before the route turns uphill to discover some beautiful views of Starý Jičín and its castle ruins. Next stop is Nový Jičín with its picturesque old town centre and funny fountain in the square. From the town, the route continues up and down with the first views of the Beskids to Štramberk. This pretty little town with its wooden houses and a mighty castle tower above is famous for its gourmet Štramberk ears!

Day 10: Štramberk – Český Těšín, approx. 65 km

Immediately after leaving Štramberk, we come to the small town of Kopřivnice - home of the famous Tatra lorries. The next stop on this rather hilly morning is Hukvaldy, a small town dominated by a mighty castle. Above all, however, the town is known as the birthplace of the innovative 19th century composer Leoš Janáček, whose house borders the cycle route! We then follow the small river Ondřejnice to the twin town of Frýdek-Místek, just in time for lunch. In the afternoon we cycle along Lake Žermanice, a lovely place for a swim! We arrive before it dries and spend the night in the border town(s) of Český Těšín/Cieszyn.

Day 11: Český Těšín – Osvětim, approx. 80 km

In the morning, we cross the border and begin the Polish part of our journey. The small roads wind gently away from the view of the mountains behind you. Our first stop is the small town of Skoczow, where we join the Wisla River. From there we cycle through a land of lakes, crowned by the mighty Goczalkowicke Dam, to the historic town of Pszyna. Here you can visit a beautiful castle and the regional museum or the Zubr Nature Park (European Buffalo). We end our day in the beautiful historic town of Oświęcim, which is unfortunately known for the nearby Oświęcim/Auschwitz concentration camp from the Second World War.

Day 12: Osvětim – Krakau, approx. 85 km

This day is one of the longest, but no need to worry. You will spend most of the day cycling along the Wisla River on flat, newly built cycle paths with marvellous views of the meandering river! As an extra for keen cyclists, you can take a detour to Lipoviec (Babice) where you can climb a majestic castle ruin, visit the town's open-air museum or simply enjoy a traditional lunch! Just before arriving in Krakow, we recommend a visit to the Dominican monastery in Tyniec, which is the oldest monastery in Poland with a history of more than 1000 years. We end our day and the entire tour in the historic city of Krakow, known as the seat of Polish kings and archbishops. If you would like to visit the memorial and museums at the Auschwitz concentration camp, you can shorten or skip your cycle tour with a train transfer to Krakow.

Day 13: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
