On this journey by bike and boat on the Danube, you will be on one of the most beautiful and popular sections of Europe's second longest river. You start in Passau, get to know the romantic Strudengau and the Nibelungengau, marvel at the impressive Melk Abbey and enjoy delicious wines in the Wachau. After an eventful discovery tour through Vienna, you return to the starting point of your journey – with many beautiful memories in your luggage!

Itinerary

Ship description

- 3 passenger decks with double beds (twin)

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Passau, Passau – Engelhartzell (boat)

Your journey by bike and ship along the Danube Cycle Path begins in the three-river city of Passau. Between 4.00 and 5.00 p.m. your floating hotel, the MS SE-Manon, will be waiting for you on board. Plan your arrival so that you still have time to visit Passau. The baroque old town of the former bishop's residence with the impressive St. Stephen's Cathedral is definitely worth a visit. In the evening it's time to cast off for Engelhartzell.

Day 2: Engelhartzell – Brandstatt, approx. 45 km, Brandstatt – Linz – Tulln (boat)

Before you get on your bike today, you can visit Engelszell Abbey. On the bike, you will comfortably follow the course of the Danube. At the Schlögenger Loop, where the Danube makes a 180-degree bend, you can enjoy impressive views of the river from one of the vantage points. In Brandstatt, board your ship, which will take you to Linz in the afternoon and in the evening we continue on to Tulln. Disembark and explore Austria's third largest city on a stroll through the pretty city centre.

Day 3: Tulln – Wien-Nussdorf, approx. 30 – 40 km

You follow the banks of the Danube eastwards and discover romantic riverside forests, small villages and castles along the way. Tulln, the birthplace of Egon Schiele, invites you to linger with its gardens, promenade and the Schiele Museum. You then cycle on at a leisurely pace - the closer you get to Vienna, the more you feel the flair of the metropolis. In Nussdorf, your ship is moored at the foot of the vineyards - perfect for a visit to a wine tavern or a first evening stroll. This section of the Danube cruise from Passau to Vienna also impressively demonstrates how diverse the Danube region is.

Day 4: Rest day in Vienna, Vienna – Wachau (boat)

Today the ship stays in place until the evening, so you can explore the Austrian capital at your own leisure. Discover the idyllic old town with its many historic buildings and monuments as well as beautiful squares and lovingly restored houses. Indulge your palate with delicious specialities in one of the many traditional coffee houses before returning to the ship. In the late evening, you will sail overnight in the Wachau to Dürnstein or Rossatz.

Day 5: Wachau / Krems – Melk, approx. 40 km

Today, the Wachau is the focus of your journey by bike and boat along the Austrian Danube. The region is one of the most picturesque in the country and is characterized by a hilly landscape and steep vineyards. Along the Danube, you can also get to know historic places such as the baroque town of Dürnstein and immerse yourself in the Middle Ages at the legendary Aggstein castle ruins. Another highlight awaits you at your destination for the day, Melk. Melk Abbey is one of the most beautiful Baroque buildings in Austria.

Day 6: Rest day in Vienna, Vienna – Wachau (boat)

Today the ship stays in place until the evening, so you can explore the Austrian capital at your own leisure. Discover the idyllic old town with its many historic buildings and monuments as well as beautiful squares and lovingly restored houses. Indulge your palate with delicious specialities in one of the many traditional coffee houses before returning to the ship. In the late evening, you will sail overnight in the Wachau to Dürnstein or Rossatz.

Day 7: Grein – Mauthausen, approx. 35 – 40 km, Mauthausen – Passau (boat)

Before you get on your bike today, it's worth taking a stroll through the charming little town of Grein. Greinburg Castle in particular will attract your attention. It is the oldest inhabited castle in Austria and can be visited as part of a guided tour. Through the hinterland of

the Strudengau region, you pass Clam Castle and the Celtic village of Mitterkirchen on your way to Mauthausen. There you have the opportunity to visit the Mauthausen concentration camp memorial.

Day 8: Individual departure from Passau

After you reach Passau at around 10.00 a.m., your Danube cruise already ends. Disembarkation starts at around 10.30 a.m. You will start your individual journey home.

Boat descriptions



MS SE-Manon

The MS SE-Manon is a premium ship that was last renovated in 2019. A relaxed and cozy atmosphere awaits you on board: You start the day in comfortably furnished cabins, which are equipped with cozy hotel beds. After your bike tour on the Danube Cycle Path, you can make use of the sauna, whirlpool or the fitness equipment in the small but fine wellness area. Or you can relax on the large sun deck, where the bicycles are also stored. If you don't want to just gaze out over the water, why not use the outdoor pool (8.70 m x 4.50 m) at the stern of the ship. In the restaurant with panoramic view your physical well-being is taken care of. Afterwards you can spend the evening in the library or in the salon.

Facts about the ship:

- 75 outside cabins: approx. 14 m² with hotel beds at ground level.
- shower / WC (cabins 306, 307, 308, 309 with bathtub), SAT-TV, safe, hairdryer, minibar and individually regulated air conditioning
- Main deck: 13 2-bed cabins; windows do not open
- Middle deck: 32 2-bed cabins; the large panorama windows can be opened
- Upper deck: 30 2-bed cabins; all cabins have a French balcony with floor-to-ceiling windows that can be opened
- Year of construction: 1999
- Renovation: 2019
- 3 passenger decks | 75 outside cabins
- Maximum occupancy: 150 passengers
- Length: 110 m
- Width: 11,4 m
- Draft: 1.5 m
