From Salzburg you cycle along the Salzach and Saalach rivers to the Krimml Waterfalls. Homely-looking villages and towns provide the backdrop to this cycling tour. You will feel a touch of the big wide world in the festival and Mozart city of Salzburg. Fantastic views of the surrounding mountains with the Hochkönig, Watzmann and Großglockner are guaranteed.

Parking in Salzburg

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival to Salzburg

Plan an early arrival in the world-famous Mozart city of Salzburg. Numerous historical and cultural sights such as the Mirabell and Hellbrunn castles and Getreidegasse with Mozart's birthplace await you. We recommend a visit to the Hohensalzburg Fortress, which towers high above the city. Enjoy the wonderful view of the baroque old town from there.

Day 2: Salzburg – Golling, approx. 35 km

Let's head south. Grab your bike right after breakfast and follow the Salzach upstream. Through shady meadows you will roll comfortably to Hallein, where you will explore the oldest salt mine in the world. Would you rather climb to lofty heights than enter the depths of a mine? Then take a short hike from Golling to the waterfall of the same name - a natural spectacle in impressive surroundings.

Day 3: Golling – St. Johann in Pongau, approx. 35 km

The moderate ascent to the Lueg pass is completed right at the beginning. You will be rewarded with a magnificent view of the Tennengebirge. The Salzach valley narrows here and you pass the Salzachklamm gorge. To the right and left of the path, the over 1000-metre-high rock walls rise into the air. The trail continues to Bischofshofen. Every year on Epiphany Day, the final jump of the Four Hills Tournament takes place at the ski jump. A few kilometres from today's overnight stop is the famous Liechtensteinklamm gorge.

Day 4: St. Johann in Pongau – Kaprun, approx. 45 km

Cycling along at a good tempo, you will reach Bruck on the Großglocknerstraße in no time. This High Alpen Road is an impressive Alpine mountain road which leads towards the Großglockner. At a height of 3798 metres, it is the highest mountain in Austria. From July onwards,

busses travel up as far as Franz-Josefs-Höhe. Thus everyone can experience the natural spectacle of might, power and permanent ice. From here it is not far to Kaprun.

Day 5: Excursion to Krimml, approx. 60 km + train ride

Today, the train takes you from Kaprun to Krimml (ticket included). A visit to the famous Krimml waterfalls is a must. Your route through the Hohe Tauern National Park is distinguished by the untamed nature of the high mountains and the colourful farming countryside of mountain meadows, woods and pastureland. Continuing down through the valley, the route takes you through small villages of the Upper Pinzgau area and back to Kaprun.

Day 6: Kaprun – Lofer, approx. 55 km

You leave the upper Salzach valley and follow the natural course of the Saalach river. The route takes you through the Saalfelden basin and through the pilgrimage place, Maria Alm. Saalfelden is the biggest town in the Pinzgau area. We recommend taking a small detour to the Seisenberg gorge, where the Weissenbach river has channelled a deep course through the limestone rocks over thousands of years.

Day 7: Lofer – Salzburg, approx. 50 km

Today the course of the previously calm river changes. In Unken, the river breaks through the Stone Lake or Steinerne Meer as it is known locally. You continue to reach the spa town of Bad Reichenhall. The river forms a natural border here between Germany and Austria. Cycling through the riverside meadows of the Saalach, you reach the Festival City of Salzburg. Follow the traces of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart or enjoy the Hohensalzburg castle.

Day 8: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
