Your tour

This cycle tour from Hamburg to Copenhagen is aimed at sporty cyclists with or without an e-bike. You reach the North Sea quickly along the Elbe. The NOK route takes you to the Baltic Sea and across the Fehmann Sound to Denmark. Copenhagen is the crowning glory of this new tour.

Journey to Hamburg

- → Closest airports: Hamburg
- → Train stations: Hamburg Hbf, Hamburg-Wilhelmsburg

Parking in Hamburg

- → Parking garage in Hamburg: Cost approx. 12 to 20 euros / day
- → Hotel parking spaces (available in individual hotels, chargeable, details in the travel documents).

Bike handover

→ Arrival: Guests' rental bikes will be available at the arrival hotel.

Departure: The guests leave the bikes at the last hotel. If an e-bike has been rented, the battery, charger and key must be returned to the reception.

Luggage transport

→ Luggage pick-up from 09.00 a.m., delivery to the next hotel by 06.00 p.m. at the latest, labeling of luggage is 1 x for the whole tour. No restriction on the number of pieces of luggage, but max. 20 kg per piece of luggage.

Travel documents

- → 1 set (per booked room) consists of: hotel list and voucher, travel information with details on daily stages, short travel guides and route descriptions, maps, luggage tags
- → Dispatched up to four weeks before arrival. For short-term bookings, delivery to the start hotel, hotel list and arrival information will be sent by email

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Hamburg

In the Hanseatic city of Hamburg, you can see and discover a lot. Therefore, we recommend an early arrival. You have a particularly good view of the hustle and bustle of the city from the cities landmark – the tower of St. Michael's.

Day 2: Hamburg – Brunsbüttel / St. Michaelisdonn, approx. 80 / 105

Your route takes you along the Elbe towards the North Sea. A first stop is worthwhile at the ship welcoming facility in Wedel. Ocean liners and cruise ships are greeted and seen off here. In Brunsbüttel you can visit the busiest artificial waterway in the world - the Kiel Canal. For a deeper insight into the history, we recommend a visit to the lock museum.

Status: 06.08.2025

Day 3: Brunsbüttel - Kiel, approx. 105 km

Today you will experience the full length of the waterway built at the end of the 19th century on your bike tour along the Kiel Canal. You cycle briskly along or near the canal. You will pass high bridges and ferry piers, and time and again you will see huge container ships and ocean-going cruise liners — impressive! A longer break is worthwhile in Rendsburg. Not only the railway bridge is worth seeing, but also the old town of Rendsburg. Follow the blue line, a path marked with a blue line that leads you to the city's sights. Kiel is the capital of Schleswig-Holstein. Take a sunbath on one of the beaches along the Kiel Fjord or take an evening stroll along the Kiellinie promenade.

Day 4: Kiel - Heiligenhafen, approx. 75 km + ferry trip

Your day starts with a ferry trip on the Kiel Fjord (not included). From Laboe you follow the Baltic Sea coastal cycle path to Heiligenhafen. This route will also take you to Brazil and California. Let yourself be surprised! There are not only numerous bathing opportunities along the way. Your overnight accommodation is also known for its great beach.

Day 5: Heiligenhafen – Maribo / Bandholm, approx. 60 / 65 km + ferry ride

Not far from the Baltic Sea, you cycle towards Fehmarn. You reach Germany's third largest island via the Fehmarnsund Bridge. Cycle past the Burger See lake to Burg, the main town on the sunny island. Enjoy a coffee in the center of Burg before you make your way to the landing stage in Puttgarden. Take the ferry to the port of Rødby on the Danish island of Lolland. You cycle along flat paths to the cozy little town of Maribo. A little further north you reach the harbor town of Bandholm. You spend the night in Bandholm or in Maribo.

Day 6: Maribo - Nykøbing / Marielyst, approx. 60 - 70 km

Today you have several options depending on where you are staying, your mood and the weather. If you wish, you can start with a round trip around Søndersø. Or you can take a detour to Bandholm. Or you can take the direct route to Nykøbing or Marielyst.

Day 7: Nykøbing – Stege, approx. 70 km + ferry ride

After breakfast, a pleasantly flat stage awaits you again today. First, the bike path leads you to the coast in the east of Falster. Enjoy beautiful views of the sea not far from the Baltic Sea and the one or other jump

into the water. For example, on the beach in Hesnæs. The small fishing village is characterized by its characteristic houses, whose walls are wrapped with straw. In Stubbekøbing, a few kilometers away, you can take a ferry ride to the island of Bogø and cycle to the island of Møn. With Stege you reach the island capital of Møns.

Day 8: Excursion to Møns Klint, approx. 55 km

The island of Møn is a popular vacation destination and rightly so. Møn has a variety of different landscapes in a very small area. Flat meadows and rocky-forested mountain ranges characterize the image of the island. Especially Møns Klint, the highest cliff in Denmark, stands out. Through the beech forest Klinteskoven you reach the up to 128 meters high chalk cliffs - a natural spectacle in a class of its own. Via stairs you reach the pebble beach, ideal for an extended walk, before you cycle back to Stege.

Day 9: Stege - Rødvig, approx. 70 km

Voday's stage of your bike tour from Odense to Copenhagen takes you from the island of Møn to Zealand. Via the Dronning Alexandrines Bro you will reach the largest island in the Baltic Sea. On slightly hilly cycle paths you will go via Præstø to Faxe Ladeplads. The sandy beach there is perfect for a long swim in the sun. Or how about a short cool down in the sea? The journey continues to Rødvig. From the harbor you can already see the Stevns Klint cliff, which you will get to know better tomorrow.

Day 10: Rødvig – Kopenhagen, approx. 80 km or 35 km + train

After breakfast, your cycle tour starts with the impressive Stevns Klint cliff. You can take a break in Højerup. The church there now lies directly on the very edge of the cliff, having been eroded by wind and sea over the centuries. We continue to the medieval harbour town of Køge. The town was once built by royal order and developed into a flourishing harbour town. Numerous half-timbered houses from the 16th and 17th centuries characterise the townscape. One particular gem is located in Kirkestræde: the oldest house in Denmark. From here, you can either follow the cycle path along the sea to Copenhagen or take the train for a shortcut (not included).

Day 11: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
