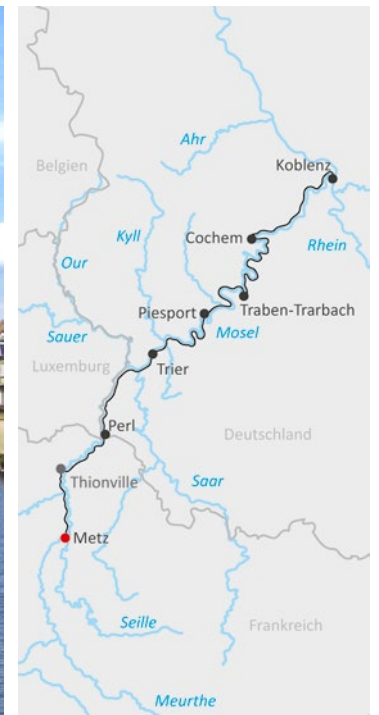

Discover the beautiful landscape of the oldest wine-growing region in Germany on your bike tour from Metz to Coblenz. As winding as the river itself, the cycle path meanders along its banks. Starting in Metz, France, you cycle relaxed into the border triangle of France, Luxembourg and Germany. You cycle leisurely past lush green vineyards and through numerous small towns with picturesque half-timbered houses. The warm hospitality of the locals in the well-known wine-growing towns of Neumagen-Dhron and Piesport will delight you. Explore and marvel at the numerous contemporary witnesses in Perl, Trier, Mehring and Coblenz.

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival to Metz

Welcome to the Moselle! Our bike tour from Metz to Koblenz starts in the northeast of France. We recommend an early arrival in Metz. The capital of Lorraine looks back on a city history of more than 3000 years. In the old town you can expect many historical buildings and numerous churches. Especially the cathedral Saint-Étienne stands out. Visit one of the lively cafés or enjoy contemporary art at the Centre Pompidou-Metz.

Day 2: Metz – Perl, approx. 65 km

The first stage of your bike tour from Metz to Koblenz takes you along the French Moselle into the border triangle of Germany, France and Luxembourg. On the way, a detour to Uckange is worthwhile. The disused blast furnace park Parc du Haute-Fourneau U4 provides insights into the former iron and steel production that was widespread in the region. With your stage destination Perl, you will reach the only wine-growing community in the Saarland. During a visit to the reconstructed Villa Borg, you will walk in the footsteps of the Romans and let yourself be transported into their everyday life.

Day 3: Perl – Treves, approx. 50 km

You follow the course of the Moselle, which also marks the border with Luxembourg up to the town of Wasserbillig. Along the river, which is lined with vineyards on both sides, you cycle via Konz to Trier. Take plenty of time to get to know Germany's oldest city during an exploratory tour. There is much to see: the Porta Nigra, the amphitheater, the Imperial Baths, the Roman Bridge, the Trier Cathedral, the Karl Marx House and and and...

Day 4: Treves – Piesport, approx. 50 km

In the Moselle Valley you will come into contact with the Roman and the winegrowing culture of the region. Today you will be able to view a very special relic from Ancient times: The Rustica in Mehring was

reconstructed according to original plans and showcases the Roman way of life. In Trittenheim, wine lovers and connoisseurs are in for treat as you can stroll around the informative vineyard path.

Day 5: Piesport – Traben-Trarbach, approx. 40 km

In the timber-framed small town of Bernkastel-Kues you will be able to admire the very pretty Market Square before continuing on to Zeltingen, a traditional winegrowing village with monastery gardens in the Moselle Baroque style. Continuing on along the Moselle you will pass through Kröv with its famous Kröver Nacktarsch vineyard before coming to Traben-Trarbach. This small town is a gem filled with buildings in the Classical and Jugendstil styles.

Day 6: Traben-Trarbach – Cochem, approx. 55 km

Passing through Zell, which is well-known for its Zeller Schwarze Katz, you will continue on to Beilstein, the Sleeping Beauty of the Moselle. The village is really similar to that of a storybook landscape! The village has changed little over the past few centuries, retaining its medieval flair. Soon you will reach Cochem, which is surrounded by rolling, wooded hills.

Day 7: Cochem – Koblenz, approx. 50 km

Today you will continue on at a fast pace along well developed cycle paths on your way to Coblenz. In Kobern-Gondorf don't forget to visit the oldest timber-framed building in Germany, the Abteihof dating from 1320! As you will have improved your level of fitness during the course of the holiday a detour to the well-known Eltz Fortress is recommended. Or why not finish off your holiday relaxing in the Old Town of Coblenz?

Day 8: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
