- Alternatively on your own by train incl. bike: Connections several times a day, without changing trains, duration approx. 1.5 – 2 hours.
- Twin / double rooms / separate beds are only occasionally available. We treat requests as non-binding customer requests, if above mentioned room types are a booking condition, it must be mentioned as a condition at the time of booking.

## Parking in Trier

- Public underground parking directly at the hotel, cost approx. 15 – 20 euros / day, payable on site.
- No reservation by Radweg-Reisen possible.

## Luggage transport

- Luggage pick-up from 09.00 a.m., delivery to the next hotel by 06.00 p.m. at the latest, labeling of luggage is 1 x for the whole tour. No restriction on the number of pieces of luggage, but max. 20 kg per piece of luggage.

## Stages description

### Day 1: Individual arrival in Treves

Welcome to the Moselle! Founded more than 2000 years ago, the Roman heritage of the oldest German city can be felt at every corner. A special testimony to the Roman era is the Porta Nigra, the Black Gate. Trier's landmark is the ideal starting point for an extensive exploration of the city. Visit the Imperial Baths, the Roman Bridge, the Trier Cathedral and gain insight into the life and work of probably the most famous Trier man in the Karl Marx House.

### Day 2: Treves – Leiwen, approx. 35 km (by bike)

On the first stage of your journey, you cycle and hike along the Moselle to Leiwen. On the way, you cycle through picturesque wine and cultural landscapes and reach Mehring. The Villa Rustica there is well worth a longer break. Built in the 2nd century, the Roman estate gradually developed into one of the largest manor houses in the area. The remains of a mosaic, reconstructed exterior façades and rooms still

bear witness to its magnificent interior. At the end of the day, treat yourself to a glass of Riesling from the surrounding vineyards at your destination of Leiwen and get in the mood for the next stages.

### Day 3: Leiwen – Neumagen-Dhron, approx. 15 km (Hiking)

Today you swap your bike for hiking boots. On foot, you will experience an impressive landscape and nature experience on the Moselsteig Trail, which takes you through vineyards and past imposing cliffs. Along the way, you will always enjoy views of the Moselle valley. You reach Neumagen-Dhron, the oldest German wine-growing community. The Neumagen wine ship in the town centre bears witness to the Roman settlement. A floatable replica is moored on the banks of the Moselle. Explore the village on a walk along the archaeological trail, which connects all the Roman sights. A wine tasting awaits you in the evening (included).

**Day 4: Neumagen-Dhron – Traben-Trarbach, approx. 45 km (by bike)**

A few kilometres after your starting point, you will reach Piesport, the largest wine-growing community on the Moselle. Here you can visit the reconstructed wine press where the Romans used to process wine. With the rock massif of the Moselloreley in view, you cycle to Bernkastel-Kues. The little half-timbered town impresses with its picturesque old town and cosy wine taverns. Sample a white wine from the Bernkasteler Doctor vineyard before you cycle comfortably to your destination for the day, Traben-Trarbach.

**Day 5: Traben-Trarbach – Beilstein – Cochem, approx. 45 km (by bike) + boat trip**

Along the Moselle, which is lined with countless vineyards, you reach the village of Zell after the next bend in the Moselle. With over four million vines, Zell is one of the largest wine-growing villages in Germany - impressive! The most famous vineyard, the Schwarze Katz, produces first-class wines that are prized the world over. After discovering the steepest vineyard in Europe near Bremm, you reach Beilstein, famous for its Metternich Castle. The Moselle boat (included) takes you to Cochem. The Reichsburg castle, which towers impressively above the town, immediately catches your eye.

**Day 6: Cochem – Winningen, approx. 45 km (by bike)**

On today's stage of your journey by bike and on foot along the Moselle, you will first cycle to Treis-Karden. The Moselle cathedral there is one of the most important churches between Trier and Koblenz. Eltz Castle is a stone's throw away, slightly off the Moselle. It is one of the most beautiful and impressive castles in Germany. Let yourself be whisked away into the history of the castle as you stroll through the Knights' Hall and marvel at valuable art treasures from different centuries. Back on the Moselle, you cycle easily through numerous pretty wine villages to Winningen, which is surrounded by steep slopes and terraces.

**Day 7: Winningen – Coblenz, approx. 15 km (Hiking)**

Today you cycle and hike along the Moselle to Koblenz. Not far from Winningen, you will reach the Hexenhügel (witches' hill). A memorial stone here commemorates the burning of witches in the 17th century. You reach your destination of Koblenz via vineyards and through green meadows. The city centre is located at the confluence of the Rhine and Moselle rivers. Pay a visit to Ehrenbreitstein Fortress with the cable car (included), which takes you suspended over the Rhine. Explore other exciting sights in Koblenz's old town and around the Deutsches Eck.

**Day 8: Individual departure**

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
