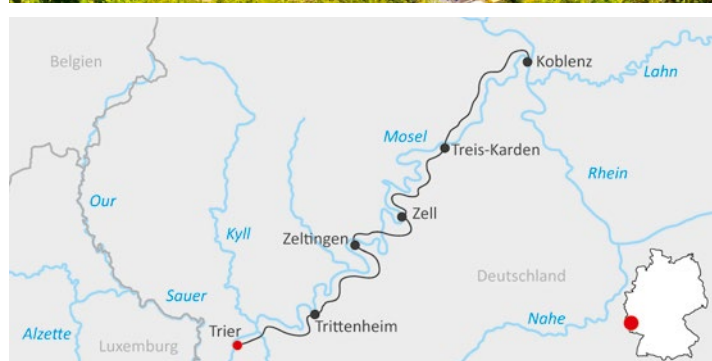

Along one of the most beautiful courses of the river, the Moselle Cycle Path takes you through the famous wine-growing region. Marvel at the Roman city of Trier with the Porta Nigra as well as Bernkastel-Kues, Trarbach and Cochem. At the confluence of the Moselle and Rhine, Koblenz awaits you with the Deutsches Eck. By the way: The tasty Moselle wines taste even better on site at the wineries.

- Twin / double rooms / separate beds are only occasionally available. We treat requests as non-binding customer requests, if above mentioned room types are a booking condition, it must be mentioned as a condition at the time of booking.

Parking in Trier

- Public underground parking directly at the hotel, cost approx. 20 euros / day, payable on site.

- Luggage pick-up from 09.00 a.m., delivery to the next hotel by 06.00 p.m. at the latest, labeling of luggage is 1 x for the whole tour. No restriction on the number of pieces of luggage, but max. 20 kg per piece of luggage.

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Treves

Welcome to the Moselle! Founded more than 2000 years ago, the Roman heritage of the oldest German city can be felt at every corner. A special testimony to the Roman era is the Porta Nigra, the Black Gate. Trier's landmark is the ideal starting point for an extensive exploration of the city. Visit the Imperial Baths, the Roman Bridge, the Trier Cathedral and gain insight into the life and work of probably the most famous Trier man in the Karl Marx House.

Day 2: Trier – Trittenheim region, approx. 40 km

Your first day in the saddle takes you out of Trier to Schweich with its wonderful old ferry boat tower. Passing sloping vineyards you arrive in Mehring, where we recommend visiting Villa Rustika with its Roman archaeological excavations. Further on the Moselle Cycle Route, you can watch the boats at Detzen before you arrive at today's destination Trittenheim.

Day 3: Trittenheim – Zeltingen, approx. 35 km

Today you will cycle through Neumagen, the oldest winegrowing area of Germany, and on to Piesport with its interesting Roman winepress. Cycling through small winegrowing villages you will reach Bernkastel, which is famous for its medieval timber framed houses. Soon after you will reach your destination of Zeltingen with its pretty buildings in baroque style.

Day 4: Zeltingen – Zell, approx. 35 km

Today's tour leads you along the Mosel through Kröv with its famous wine producing region of Kröver Nacktarsch, and on to Traben-Trarbach. This small town is a jewel in classical and Jugendstil style. You then continue to cycle along the Zeller Hamm, a hill which the Mosel loops past and on to Zell, which has 4.5 million vines and is one of the largest winegrowing areas.

Day 5: Zell – Treis-Karden, approx. 50 km

Passing charming little villages, the route winds along the Mosel to Beilstein with its pretty timber-frame historic quarter. Looking down on the town are the ruins of Metternich, which was once owned by the Reichs Chancellor of the same name. The holiday town of Cochem follows, and Reichsburg castle. The ruins of Coraidelstein provide the backdrop to your route as you finally reach today's destination.

Day 6: Treis-Karden – Koblenz, approx. 40 km

The well-paved paths mean that you can speed along on your way to Koblenz. On the way, you should visit Germany's oldest timber-frame house, the Abteihof in Kobern-Gondorf, from 1320. In Koblenz we recommend taking a trip to the famous Deutsche Eck – the German corner where Mosel and Rhine merge. The climb to the fort of Ehrenbreitenstein is rewarded with an almost overwhelming panoramic view.

Day 7: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
