Your tour

Between the Eifel and the Hunsrück, the Moselle meanders through one of Germany's most famous wine-growing regions. Sublime castles, Roman forts, romantic half-timbered towns and countless vineyards characterise the picture of this journey between Treves and Koblenz. The crowning finale of the tour is the excursion to the Loreley on the Rhine: upstream by boat and back to Koblenz by bike.

Parking in Trier

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Treves

Welcome to the Moselle! Founded more than 2000 years ago, the Roman heritage of the oldest German city can be felt at every corner. A special testimony to the Roman era is the Porta Nigra, the Black Gate. Trier's landmark is the ideal starting point for an extensive exploration of the city. Visit the Imperial Baths, the Roman Bridge, the Trier Cathedral and gain insight into the life and work of probably the most famous Trier man in the Karl Marx House.

Day 2: Trier – Mülheim, approx. 60 km

The first stage of your bike tour from Trier to Koblenz takes you along the Moselle, which winds through its valley framed by vineyards. A stopover is worthwhile in Neumagen-Dhron. Germany's oldest wine village once served the Romans as the site of a fort and as a landing stage for ships. The Neumagen wine ship, whose wooden replica lies at anchor in the harbor, bears witness to this. Just a stone's throw away is Piesport, the largest wine-growing community on the Moselle. Visit

the Roman winepress and taste a sparkling Riesling from the famous Piesporter Goldtröpfchen vineyard. Passing the Mosellorey, a steep rock massif, you will reach Mülheim after a few kilometers.

Day 3: Mülheim – Traben-Trarbach, approx. 30 km

The first highlight of your cycling day today is the half-timbered town of Bernkastel-Kues. Situated at the foot of steep vineyards, the old town presents itself with colorful houses, small alleys and castle-like wine yards. Above the town is the ruined castle of Landshut. From the keep you have a beautiful view over the Moselle valley. Via Kröv, known for its Kröver Nacktarsch vineyard, you will reach Traben-Trarbach. Thanks to its many half-timbered buildings and charming Art Nouveau villas, this wine trading town has one of the most beautiful riverside promenades on the Moselle.

Day 4: Traben-Trarbach – Cochem / Treis-Karden, approx. 55 / 65 km

First you cycle to Zell. Situated on the narrowest loop of the Moselle, the small town has over four million vines and is one of the largest wine-growing communities on the Moselle after Piesport. The world-renowned Schwarze Katz vineyard produces excellent Rieslings that can be sampled on site. Onward. Cochem's Reichsburg Castle will catch your eye from afar. The impressive landmark of the city looks back on a history of over 1000 years. You can also get high up on the Cochem chairlift, which will take you to the Pinnerkreuz lookout point. Magnificent views guaranteed!

Day 5: Cochem – Koblenz, approx. 50 / 40 km

You cycle relaxed along the Moselle and reach Treis-Karden. The Mosel Cathedral dominates the townscape of the village, which lies on both sides of the Mosel. It is one of the most impressive churches on the Lower Moselle. Another highlight on this stage of your bike tour from Trier to Koblenz awaits you a bit away from the river: Eltz Castle. With its towers and oriels, it is one of the most beautiful castles in Germany. Back on the Moselle Cycle Path, you will reach Koblenz. Take an evening stroll to the famous Deutsches Eck. There the Moselle flows into the Rhine.

Day 6: Excursion to Sankt Goarshausen, approx. 40 km + boat trip

After breakfast, you will travel by boat on the Rhine to St. Goarshausen. From the pretty old town of the village it is only a stone's throw to the Loreley. The slate rock, which is over 130 meters high, is located at one of the narrowest points of the Middle Rhine Valley. The rock became famous through the legend of the beautiful virgin Loreley, who lured passing boatmen to their doom with her song. Return to Koblenz by bike via Boppard. Visit the Ehrenbreitenstein Fortress, which you reach by cable car suspended over the Rhine.

Day 7: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
