

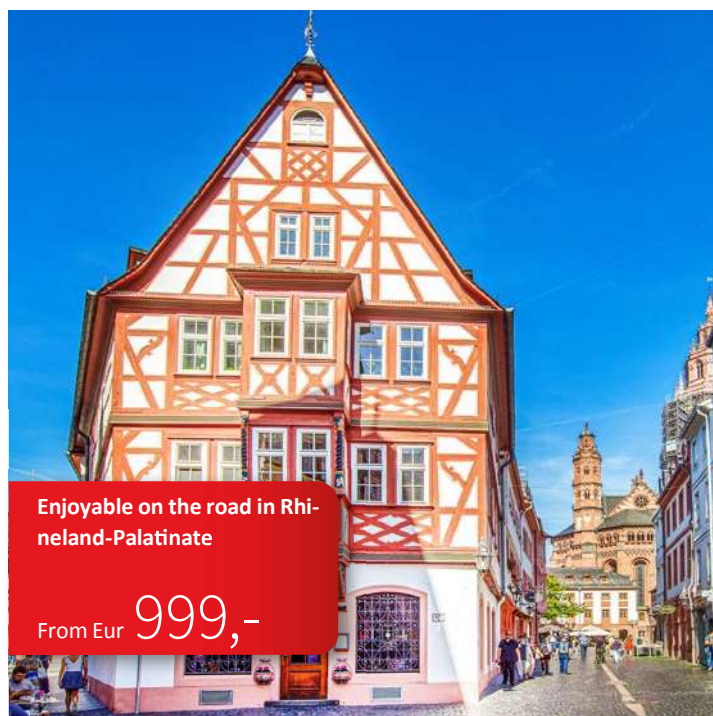
The Moselle-Rhine Cycle Route

Your tour

Our journey on the Moselle-Rhine Cycle Route takes you through one of Germany's most beautiful wine regions. Both the Moselle and the region along the Middle Rhine offer ideal conditions for an enjoyable and eventful cycling holiday. From Trier, you cycle for around 300 kilometres through small winegrowing villages and historic towns, passing lush vineyards and varied landscapes. On our tour, you will cycle almost without ascents along the two rivers lined with numerous castles and ancient Roman buildings.

- Twin / double rooms / separate beds are only occasionally available. We treat requests as non-binding customer requests, if above mentioned room types are a booking condition, it must be mentioned as a condition at the time of booking.

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Treves

Welcome to the Moselle! Founded more than 2000 years ago, the Roman heritage of the oldest German city can be felt at every corner. A special testimony to the Roman era is the Porta Nigra, the Black Gate. Trier's landmark is the ideal starting point for an extensive exploration of the city. Visit the Imperial Baths, the Roman Bridge, the Trier Cathedral and gain insight into the life and work of probably the most famous Trier man in the Karl Marx House.

Day 2: Treves – Trittenheim / Piesport / Mülheim, approx. 40 – 60 km

The traces of the Romans will continue to accompany you on the first stage of your journey on the Moselle-Rhine cycle path. Visit the Villa Rustica in Mehring and treat yourself to a Riesling from the well-known Apotheke vineyard in the wine village of Trittenheim. Wine also plays or played an important role in Neumagen-Dhron. The Neumagen wine ship in the centre of the village is a tomb, which suggests that Moselle wine was already being transported in ancient times. Piesport is the largest wine-growing community on the Moselle. Mülheim, idyllically situated in the midst of vineyards, is in no way inferior. Spend the night in Trittenheim, Piesport or Mülheim.

Day 3: Piesport – Traben-Trarbach, approx. 40 km

In the timber-framed small town of Bernkastel-Kues you will be able to admire the very pretty Market Square before continuing on to Zeltingen, a traditional winegrowing village with monastery gardens in the Moselle Baroque style. Continuing on along the Moselle you will pass through Kröv with its famous Kröver Nacktarsch vineyard before coming to Traben-Trarbach. This small town is a gem filled with buildings in the Classical and Jugendstil styles.

Day 4: Traben-Trarbach – Cochem / Treis-Karden, approx. 55 / 65 km

First you cycle to Zell. Situated on the narrowest loop of the Moselle, the small town has over four million vines and is one of the largest wine-growing communities on the Moselle after Piesport. The world-renowned Schwarze Katz vineyard produces excellent Rieslings that can be sampled on site. Onward. Cochem's Reichsburg Castle will catch your eye from afar. The impressive landmark of the city looks back on a history of over 1000 years. You can also get high up on the Cochem chairlift, which will take you to the Pinnerkreuz lookout point. Magnificent views guaranteed!

Day 5: Cochem – Koblenz, approx. 50 / 40 km

You cycle relaxed along the Moselle and reach Treis-Karden. The Mosel Cathedral dominates the townscape of the village, which lies on both sides of the Mosel. It is one of the most impressive churches on the Lower Moselle. Another highlight on this stage of your bike tour from Trier to Koblenz awaits you a bit away from the river: Eltz Castle. With its towers and oriels, it is one of the most beautiful castles in Germany. Back on the Moselle Cycle Path, you will reach Koblenz. Take an evening stroll to the famous Deutsches Eck. There the Moselle flows into the Rhine.

Day 6: Koblenz – St. Goar / Oberwesel, approx. 40 / 50 km

You will be travelling along the Rhine for the next two days. From Koblenz, follow it southwards. Halfway along the Rhine Cycle Route, you will reach the small town of Boppard without any climbs. The town, which is also characterised by winegrowing, is located on the largest bend in the Rhine. The route continues to St. Goar. The Loreley is located on the opposite side of the Rhine. The rock became famous through the legend of the beautiful maiden Loreley. She is said to have lured the Rhine boatmen to their doom with her singing. Above St. Goar are the ruins of Rheinfels Castle, the largest castle and fortress complex on the Middle Rhine.

Day 7: St. Goar – Mainz, approx. 65 / 55 km

The last stage of your journey on the Moselle-Rhine cycle path is a brisk ride towards your destination. With the Hunsrück on your right and the Taunus on your left, you cycle to Mainz not far from the Rhine with virtually no inclines. The state capital of Rhineland-Palatinate was already inhabited in Roman times. Particularly worth seeing is the six-towered St Martin's Cathedral, which is one of the highlights of Romanesque church architecture on the Rhine alongside the cathedrals of Speyer and Worms. Opposite the cathedral is the Gutenberg Museum. This unique museum of printing art provides an insight into the printing technology with movable type invented by the city's most famous son, Johannes Gutenberg.

Day 8: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
