Your tour

On this bike tour you will discover the most beautiful corners of the Southern Eifel. In one week, experience the enchanting river landscapes of the Moselle, Kyll, Prüm and Sauer surrounded by castles, palaces and rock formations. Our cycle tour begins in Trier. Through the picturesque Kyll valley you reach Bitburg, which is not only famous for its brewery. Along the Kyll you continue to Gerolstein, surrounded by dolomite rocks. Via the Eifel-Ardenne cycle path you reach Prüm – with its magnificent prince’s abbey a real eye-catcher! Along the Prüm river you cycle to the Irrel waterfalls. In Wasserbillig you meet the Moselle again, which leads you back into the heart of Trier. As you will have to reckon with one or two ascents along the way, we recommend this tour to cyclists who are in good basic condition.

Stages description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Treves

Welcome to the Moselle! Founded more than 2000 years ago, the Roman heritage of the oldest German city can be felt at every corner. A special testimony to the Roman era is the Porta Nigra, the Black Gate. Trier's landmark is the ideal starting point for an extensive exploration of the city. Visit the Imperial Baths, the Roman Bridge, the Trier Cathedral and gain insight into the life and work of probably the most famous Trier man in the Karl Marx House.

Day 2: Trier – Bitburg, approx. 55 km

You leave Trier along the Moselle. From Ehrang, you are on the Kyll cycle path. It largely runs parallel to the Kyll, the longest river in the Eifel. Beautiful panoramas and impressive natural landscapes await you along the way. A little away from the Kyll, you reach your destination for the day, Bitburg. The town is known for its traditional brewery. The Romans already developed the town into a roadside fort. Remnants of the old town wall can still be seen today in the historic old town centre.

Day 3: Bitburg – Gerolstein, approx. 40 km

Today's stage is also on the Kyll cycle path, which takes you via Kyllburg with its imposing collegiate church to Mürtenbach. Bertrada Castle can be seen from afar. Historians believe that Charlemagne was born in the castle. The route continues to your stage destination of Gerolstein. Surrounded by dolomite cliffs, the town in the Volcanic Eifel is famous for its mineral springs. Leave your bike and take a short hike to the Buchenloch Cave, which served as a dwelling cave for humans and animals many thousands of years ago.

Day 4: Gerolstein – Prüm, approx. 45 km

From Gerolstein, you are travelling on the Eifel-Ardenne cycle path. For the most part, you follow the course of an old railway line, which is characterised by hilly terrain with only slight inclines. Your destination for the day, the climatic health resort of Prüm, lies in the middle of the Prüm limestone basin and is known for its magnificent St Salvator's Basilica. As part of Prüm Abbey, it is the town's landmark. The church has a baroque exterior and a gothic interior.

Day 5: Prüm – Echternach, approx. 75 km

Today you cycle along the Kyll cycle path, mostly along the Prüm. As far as Waxweiler, you follow the former route of the West Eifel Railway. A little away from the Prüm, you cycle to Biersdorf, accompanied by a few climbs. Leave your bike and take a walk along the five-kilometre lakeside promenade. Back on your bike, you cycle to Echternach. The rapids of the Prüm are another highlight of this stage.

Day 6: Echternach – Treves, approx. 40 km

You follow the gentle meanders of the Sûre on the Sûre Valley Cycle Path, which takes you to Wasserbillig. Here the Sûre flows into the Moselle. On the Moselle cycle path, the last stage of your cycle tour

on the Kyll cycle path takes you first to Igel. In the town centre, marvel at the richly decorated Roman Igel Column, which is one of the largest gravestones north of the Alps. In your destination of Trier, a walk along the wine culture trail above the amphitheatre is well worthwhile. It shows you the cultivation and history of wine at every turn.

Day 7: Individual departure

After breakfast you start your individual return journey home or extend your stay.
