Your Tour

The trip takes you through the „real north“ of Germany. You cycle along the banks of the Lower Elbe and the varied coasts of the Baltic and North Seas of Schleswig-Holstein. Shorter and longer stages take you along the Elbe and across the Kiel Canal to the sandy beaches of Eckernförde. Relax in the dunes of Sylt before the journey takes you to the kilometer-long beach of St. Peter-Ording and through the Dithmarschen back to Hamburg.

Bike handover

- Arrival: The rental bikes are waiting at the start hotel.
- Departure: The guests leave their bikes in the last hotel. Provided an e-bike has been rented, the battery should be handed in at reception.

Luggage transport

- Daily baggage collection until 9 a.m.
- Delivery to the next hotel by 6 p.m. at the latest
- Luggage items are labeled once for the entire tour
- No restriction on the number of pieces of luggage, but a maximum of 20 kg per piece of luggage

Stage description

Day 1: Individual arrival in Hamburg

In the Hanseatic city of Hamburg, you can see and discover a lot. Therefore, we recommend an early arrival. You have a particularly good view of the hustle and bustle of the city from the city's landmark – the tower of St. Michael's.

Day 2: Hamburg – Brunsbüttel, approx. 80 km

Your route takes you along the Elbe towards the North Sea. A first stop is worthwhile at the ship welcoming facility in Wedel. Ocean liners and cruise ships are greeted and seen off here. In Brunsbüttel you can visit the busiest artificial waterway in the world - the Kiel Canal. For a deeper insight into the history, we recommend a visit to the lock museum.

Day 3: Brunsbüttel – Eckernförde, approx. 90 km

You follow the Kiel Canal mostly close to the shore and without any particular inclines. On the way you can observe different types of ships. After passing the Wittensee, you reach the 700-year-old harbour town of Eckernförde.

Day 4: Eckernförde – Schleswig – Kappeln, approx. 70 km

Today you first reach Schleswig. Even from a distance, you can see St. Peter's Cathedral, the town's landmark. Along the river Schlei you reach Arnis, the smallest town in Germany and a few kilometres later you reach your destination for the day, Kappeln. Here the museum harbour is particularly worth seeing.

Day 5: Kappeln – Flensburg, approx. 75 km

Mostly with a view of the Baltic Sea you cycle first to Glücksburg. Glücksburg, Germany's northernmost town, boasts one of the most beautiful castles in Northern Europe. After a rest, you continue to Flensburg, your destination for the day. The history of Flensburg goes back more than 750 years.

Day 6: Flensburg – Niebüll, approx. 65 / 80 km

Heading west and through flat marsh and geest landscapes, you quickly reach Niebüll, your overnight stop today. The name is derived from Frisian and means new settlement. It is worth visiting the Frisian Museum. There you gain insights into the living and economic culture of the North Frisians.

Day 7: Excursion to the Island of Sylt, approx. 75 km + train ride

By train, you travel on the Hindenburg dam to the island of Sylt. The island has a network of cycle paths covering more than 200 kilometres. You decide which route you would like to take to explore the island. The train brings you back to Niebüll in the evening.

Day 8: Niebüll – Husum, approx. 80 km

Not long after you start your cycling day you pass the harbour towns of Dagebüll and Schlüttsiel. Always along the coast, a first detour to the Hamburger Hallig is worthwhile. The peninsula is only one square kilometre in size. Today's destination is Husum, the hometown of the famous writer Theodor Storm. He once described the town as a grey city by the sea. However, you will be greeted by a lively town and a colourful harbour

Day 9: Husum – St. Peter-Ording – Tönning, approx. 85 km

Your cycle tour takes you to the Eiderstedt peninsula. The 40-metre high red and white striped lighthouse, the landmark of North Friesland, can already be seen from afar. A long break is recommended in St. Peter-Ording. Strengthened, you continue to Tönning, your destination for the day. In the Multimar Wattforum you can learn more about life in the Wadden Sea.

Day 10: Tönning – St. Michaelisdonn, approx. 65 km

On your cycling route today you find the largest coastal protection structure in Germany – the Eider Barrage. Your first stop thereafter is recommended in Büsum. It is the origin of the famous Büsum crabs. On the way, there is always the opportunity for a refreshment in the sea and a relaxing sunbath on one of the many sandy beaches. Refreshed, the tour continues through the Dithmarschen to St. Michaelisdonn.

Day 11: St. Michaelisdonn – Hamburg, approx. 105 km

Today the last, but also longest stage of your cycle tour awaits you. The route includes mostly flat cycle paths. Along the Kiel Canal you reach Hamburg after a total of 790 km. You may decide how you would like to spend the last evening in the metropolis on the Elbe.

Day 12: Individual departure or extension of stay

After breakfast, you start your individual return journey home or we extend your stay.
